

# Athletic Department Receives Grants

The end of the school year saw Foundation support for the following programs: Canoe Paddling - \$1,300 for the purchase of new paddles in preparation of the new paddling season underway. Volleyball - \$1,100 for the purchase of two new nets and antenna. Boys Soccer - \$800 to replace training equipment. Athletics - \$4,400 to replace two ice machines.

## Automotive Program Recouping After Break-In

During the school break last summer, theft of tools and equipment valued at \$7,000 had left the automotive program at a loss. In order to survive the school year, a request to the Foundation was made to replace the basic measuring tools and punch sets. In order to help this valuable trade program stay alive, the Foundation awarded a \$1,000 grant to replace some of its loss. Thank you to the Mahelona Medical Center Security Personnel for helping to be on the look out for suspicious activity in our area.





## Special Education — Community Based Instruction Program

We are privileged to have two very dedicated Special Education instructors who graciously devote their time and energy to build the Community Based Instruction (CBI) and Work Programs at Kapaa High School. Special thanks to Tamarine Carvalho and Crystal Rowe for your dedication to our students with special needs!



The CBI focuses on developing independent life skills which includes the planning and preparation of meals in their homes and on their job sites. Students are taught hands-on activities from menu planning, food shopping, cooking, packing and serving. This year the Foundation was involved in providing funds to help the program purchase food items for the program's cooking activities by awarding \$2,000 over the course of the year. As a special thank you, the students baked mini pumpkin pies for members of the Foundation Board which were enjoyed by all at the November meeting. Thank you, students – they were delicious!
