

THE JANICE BOND SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Janice Bond Scholarship, established in 2021, will award a \$1,000.00 to a student of the Kapa‘a High School Class of 2021. Janice Bond was a school teacher from 1969 to 1987 and mentored and educated many students in the public school system especially at Kapa‘a High & Intermediate School. This scholarship is being offered to a student who has aspirations to become a teacher.

Scholarship applications are available at the Kapa‘a High School counselors’ office or online at the Kapa‘a High School Foundation’s website, official Facebook or Instagram page. All applications must be postmarked or received by **Friday, April 9, 2021**.

Terms of Application for Scholarships

- 1) Applicant must be a senior at Kapa‘a High School.
- 2) Applicant was born and raised on Kaua‘i; attended elementary, middle and high school on Kaua‘i.
- 3) Applicant shall have a grade point average of 2.0 or higher.
- 4) If awarded, the individual must email a brief write up and photo describing the scholarship’s impact after starting at the higher learning institution for posting on the Kapa‘a High School Foundation’s website.
- 5) Applicant must have applied on the Form made available through the Janice Bond Scholarship via the Kapa‘a High School Foundation, available at the counselors’ office or online at the Kapa‘a High School Foundation’s website or official Facebook or Instagram page.
- 6) Applicants must submit, along with the Application Form, a Resume summarizing the applicant’s academic, extracurricular & community activities.
- 7) One letter of recommendation based on community service participation.
- 8) One-page type written double space personal essay addressing career plans, how this scholarship will enhance future goals and what I want to do in the future to give back to the Kaua‘i community.
- 9) These documents should be legible, properly sealed and sent with the application form or by email with attached scanned documents. See specific return instructions provided on page 2 of this document.

Deadline for applications to be received via email or postmarked is **Friday, April 9, 2021. NO LATE OR INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED. RESPONSIBILITY FOR TIMELY SUBMISSION RESTS WITH THE APPLICANT.**
