The *Dream Big Scholarship* was established by the Tanaka family as an expression of love and admiration for our father/grandfather, Abe Tanaka, Kapa'a High School Class of 1949, and his beloved teacher, Margaret Fortner. Ms. Fortner saw a spark in Abe that went beyond his athletic talents and accomplishments. She encouraged Abe to dream big and inspired him to equally value academics with his love of sports. With Ms. Fortner's guidance and unwavering belief in him, Abe flourished academically and athletically, eventually attending and graduating from Drake University. Abe then went on to become a fighter pilot in the United States Air Force, rising to the rank of Lt. Colonel. Throughout all of Abe's success, he understood that nothing would be possible without Ms. Fortner. When Abe returned home to Kapa'a, he immediately went to see Ms. Fortner to thank her and tell her of the tremendous impact she had in his life; unfortunately, Ms. Fortner had passed away. Over the years, Abe has carried great sadness and remorse that he was never able to thank his beloved teacher and tell her what a difference she made in his life. Ms. Fortner's long-lasting impact is proof that it just takes one person to make a difference in someone's life. This scholarship is dedicated to Ms. Fortner and is a way to pay her kindness and guidance forward to others.

Terms of Application for Scholarship

- 1. Applicant is a senior at Kapa'a High School with a grade point average of 2.0 or higher.
- 2. Applicant has participated/been involved in athletics while attending Kapa'a High School and has made academic improvement.
- 3. One-page type written double space personal essay addressing importance of balancing academics and athletics, how this scholarship with enhance future goals and how this opportunity could be used to pay it forward to others in the future
- 4. A letter of recommendation from current or past Kapa'a High School teacher or coach highlighting applicants' academic improvement and untapped potential for future success.
- 5. Applicant shall submit a copy of letter of acceptance from college or university that applicant will attend, or statement explaining acceptance before scholarship check is issued.
- 6. A brief resume summarizing student's academic and athletic achievements, extracurricular activities, and community service.
- 7. Applicant must complete the application form through The Abraham Tanaka/Margret Fortner "Dream Big" Scholarship via the Kapa'a High School Foundation, available at the counselors' office or online at the Kapa'a High School Foundation's website or official Facebook page.
- 8. These documents should be legible and sent with the application form by email with attached scanned documents. See specific return instructions provided on page 2 of this document.

Deadline for applications is **Monday April 11, 2022. NO LATE OR INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED. RESPONSIBILITY FOR TIMELY SUBMISSION RESTS WITH THE APPLICANT.**
